COLONOSCOPY INSTRUCTIONS: HALFLYTELY PREP

You have an appointment for a colonoscopy with Dr. Goldstein on _____ at _____.
This will be performed at Carnegie Hill Endoscopy Center, 1516 Lexington Avenue, between 97th and 98th streets.
Please arrive forty-five minutes before your procedure for registration. To Contact, call 212-860-6300.

One week before your appointment:

- Fill the prescription for HalfLyteLy prep kit at your pharmacy.
- If you take aspirin, coumadin, Plavix, other blood thinners, or anti-inflammatory medications, call the office to discuss this. Most patients will be asked to stop these medications.
- If you have a heart murmur or artificial heart valve, please call the office to discuss this. If antibiotics are needed, we will administer them at the time of the procedure.
- If you have a bleeding disorder or type I diabetes, please call the office to discuss this condition.
- Do not take iron for one week before the colonoscopy.

On the day before your colonoscopy:

- In the morning, mix the Halflytely according to the instructions on the bottle and place in the refrigerator.
- You may have a normal light breakfast, but no raw fruit or vegetables.
- You may take all your regular medications, except iron, anti-diarrhea medicines, and aspirin or blood-thinners (unless specifically told to by the doctor).
- Starting at lunch, you may only have a liquid diet, including water, juice, coffee, tea, soda, clear soup, jello, and Gatorade. Yogurt and ice cream are also allowed. Continue to drink liquids throughout the day.
- At approximately 5PM, take the Dulcolax tablet included in the prep kit.
- At 7 PM, begin to drink the Halflytely, one large glass approximately every ten minutes. You should finish the bottle within two hours.
- Continue to drink liquids until bedtime, but nothing after midnight.

On the day of your colonoscopy:

- Do not have anything to eat or drink except your regular medicines, with a little water. If you are diabetic, do not take oral diabetes medicines.
- **Make sure you bring someone with you to the procedure, as it is likely that you will receive sedating medications and will need an escort home for your safety.**

Please make sure that the office has any necessary referrals or your procedure may be cancelled.

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**INSTRUCTIONS FOR PATIENTS HAVING OUTPATIENT PROCEDURES AT
CARNEGIE HILL ENDOSCOPY**

Thank you for making an appointment with Dr. Goldstein to have an endoscopic examination. His office has arranged for your endoscopic procedure to be performed at Carnegie Hill Endoscopy, an ambulatory endoscopy center. Specific preparation instructions for the examination are enclosed on a separate sheet.

Please read the following information, which is very important:

- Carnegie Hill Endoscopy is located at 1516 Lexington Avenue, between 97th – 98th Streets
- It is important that you arrive in time for your appointment, or the procedure may be cancelled. Try to arrive for registration forty-five minutes before your scheduled appointment to allow for registration and preprocedural intake by the staff.
- There is a drop-off area at the front door on Lexington Avenue. Discounted parking is available in the building's parking lot, located on 98th Street between Park and Lexington Avenues. Please inform the attendant that you are coming for a procedure at Carnegie Hill Endoscopy.
- Prior to the exam, you must register at the registration area. From there you will be escorted to the endoscopy area.
- The center requires that you bring a companion with you to escort you home, or the procedure will not be performed. There is a waiting room for your companion.
- After the procedure, you will be monitored by the nursing staff and discharged the same day. You will receive sedation medication for the procedure and will not be able to safely drive a car yourself.
- Most procedures performed in an "ambulatory surgery center" (endoscopy center) require precertification and/or referrals from your insurance company if you have private insurance. (This does not apply to Medicare patients.) Please call your insurance company to see if precertification and/or referrals are needed according to your policy. The insurance company can also determine what deductibles may apply, again, according to your policy.

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DIRECTIONS TO CARNEGIE HILL ENDOSCOPY

- By Bus: the M10, M102, or M103 buses run north on Third Avenue and south on Lexington Avenue. If north-bound, get off at 98th Street and Third Avenue and walk to Lexington. If south-bound, get off at 98th Street and Lexington in front of the center. For more bus information go to www.mta.info/nyct/maps/submap
- By Subway: Take the 6 Train to 96th Street. Walk north along Lexington Avenue; the center is located on the northwest block between 97th and 98th Streets
- If you are driving:
 - **From New Jersey:** Take the George Washington Bridge to Harlem River Drive (which becomes FDR Drive) south to 96th Street exit. Right turn on 96th Street. Proceed to Third Avenue and make right turn, then second left onto 98th Street. Proceed to Lexington Avenue, then turn left to the Center.
 - **From Long Island:** Triborough Bridge to Manhattan. Harlem River Drive (which becomes FDR Drive) south to 96th Street exit. Right turn on 96th Street. Proceed to Third Avenue and make right turn, then second left onto 98th Street. Proceed to Lexington Avenue, then turn left to the Center.
 - **From Westchester/Connecticut:** Take Major Deegan (Rte 87) towards the Triborough Bridge. Take the Manhattan Bridge to the FDR Drive South. Exit at 96th Street. Take right turn on 96th Street. Proceed to Third Avenue and make right turn, then second left onto 98th Street. Proceed to Lexington Avenue, then turn left to the Center.
